Accomplishments/Successes for 2013-2014

1. Senate support for advancing SLO process:
 - Proposal for Department SLO Facilitators, including compensation
 - Official definition of authentic assessment for SLOs
 - Official rubric for Course Learning Outcomes (CLO)
 - Require all Course Outlines of Records submitted to Curriculum committee must have CLOs before being placed on Curriculum Committee agenda
 - Approved SLO Handbook
 - Approved the CLO Technical Review Checklist and process.
 - College Policy for SLO Sustainability
2. Senate support for curriculum processes under 10+1:
 - Requirement that all certificates (skills or certificates of achievement) must have advisory committee minutes to be considered by Curriculum Committee
 - Position defining recency for CTE advisory committee minutes
 - Position supporting local control of college curriculum
 - Position supporting 21 unit District GE pattern
 - Supported the Curriculum Committee by endorsing the April 17, 2014, deadline for all DE addenda to be updated to reflect best practices and accreditation standards

 - Revised ELAC Winter Unit Limit Policy for Veterans
 - Policy for Renaming Department and form to be used
 - Generic Policy for Establishing a Department Hiring Selection Committee
 - Revised Ethics policy.
4. Adopted a number of Academic Senate Positions:
 - Position supporting GO East LA collaboration with CSULA & LAUSD
 - Endorsed application of ELAC as leader college (ATD)
 - Reaffirmed 18 unit semester enrollment limit
 - Accepted the Shared Governance Process for the Identification and Selection of the Graduation Keynote Speaker, which the College President has agreed to follow

Struggles of 2013-2014

1. Communicating Senate issues with departments and adjunct faculty
2. Updating Senate website and meeting Brown Act requirements
3. District Academic Senate's movement toward centralized decision-making on curriculum and other matters
4. Extensive consultation with AFT and College President on ISA Policy has delayed development of a final draft policy to present to Senate and interested faculty
5. Ensuring that consultation with Academic Senate is not bypassed when it is required
6. Ensuring continued respect for district/college policies regarding Senate/faculty representation
