Degree Path and Requirements:

By completing the curriculum recommended in this Program Map for the Associate of Arts in Law, Public Policy and Society for Transfer Degree, students will have also completed the Legal Office Assistant Skills Certificate, Executive Legal Office Certificate of Achievement and Legal Support Professional Certificate of Achievement.

Students will also be on the pathway to completing the International Law and Public Policy Certificate of Achievement, with the addition of just 3 courses. Some of the courses recommended in this Map also fulfill course requirements for other AA or AS-T degrees offered as part of ELAC's Business Department.

Students can earn multiple certificates and degrees simultaneously. Completing certificates or dual degrees may give students an advantage in applications to 4-year transfer universities and for career employment opportunities.

Department Advising Notes:

There are no prerequisites for the required Law courses, so students may take LAW 001, LAW 002 and LAW 008 simultaneously.

Program Description

The Associate of Arts Degree for Transfer in Law, Public Policy and Society for Transfer is designed to meet requirements for guaranteed transfer to the California State University System (CSU). The degree provides a broad multidisciplinary curriculum appropriate preparation for transfer to a wide variety of CSU majors such as: American Studies, Communications, Criminal Justice, Criminology, Global Intelligence and National Security, International

Relations, Philosophy, Political Science, Social Behavioral Sciences (Law or Political Economy Concentrations) Note: This list of transfer destination majors is not meant to be exhaustive, and there are many more destination major options exist.

The degree is designed to prepare students for success in advanced graduate degree programs by providing strong critical thinking, writing, and communication skills that are the foundation for success in law school or other graduate programs.

Career and Transfer Opportunities

The degree is also suitable for Government, Public Service and Legal employment positions that require a college degree in a job-related field. Completion of this degree can help prepare students for jobs and careers in related fields, including jobs in government, law, law enforcement, business, international business and in the non-profit sector.

Completion of this Transfer Degree guarantees admission to a local CSU. This degree also satisfies the transfer requirements for students seeking admission to non-local CSU and all UC campuses.
