Program Course	ADM JUS 004	Principles and Procedures of the Justice Syst	3	ADM JUS 004 provides is a study of the role and responsibilities within the criminal justice system: Law enforcement, judicial, and corrections.	This class is only offered in the classroom and only during the fall and spring semesters.
Program Course	ADM JUS 285	Directed Study- Administration of Justice	2	ADM JUS 285, allows students to pursue directed study in Administration of Justice on a contract basis under the direction of a supervising instructor. Students need to successfully complete ADM JUS 001, ADM JUS 002, ADM JUS 003, and ADM JUS 004 before taking ADM JUS 285.
