Program Description

The Associates in Science in Nutrition and Dietetics for Transfer Degree is designed to award an Associate in Science degree to those who are intending requirements for the Associate in Science in Nutrition and Dietetics for Transfer degree were chosen solely to meet the requirements of the Transfer Model Curriculum in Nutrition and Dietetics and may not be adequate preparation for transfer to institutions outside of the California State University system. Students are required to complete 60 semester units or 90 quarter units of CSU transferable coursework with a minimum overall grade point average of 2.0, including a minimum grade of "C" (or "P") for each course in the major, and completion of IGETC and/or CSU GE-Breadth.
