Program Description

East Los Angeles College provides the California Board of Registered Nursing approved pre-licensure program that is designed to educate a diverse population of students for an entry level registered nursing position. The program consists of coursework in general education, science, nursing, and clinical practice in various in-patient and out-patient settings. Nursing course content include pharmacology, fundamentals of nursing, medical surgical nursing, obstetrics, pediatric, psychiatric/mental health, and management/leadership nursing. The ELAC RN program prepares students to be caring, safe, and competent members of the nursing workforce in healthcare settings. Upon completion of the program, the graduates will be eligible to take the National Council for Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN). Successful passing of the NCLEX-RN will lead to licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN).

Career and Transfer Opportunities

Earning an Associate Degree in Nursing at ELAC is the first major step in the professional nursing career ladder. ELAC graduates have an opportunity to transfer to CSUs, UCs, and private universities to go on to pursue higher education and career advancement in the nursing profession. Many ELAC graduates have earned advanced degrees such as, Bachelor's Degree in Nursing Science, Master's Degree in Nursing Science, and Doctor's degree in Nursing Practice. These individuals are well respected in the community and nursing profession. After completing the program within 3 months, taking, and passing the National examination, and receiving a CA RN license, ELAC RN graduates are hired in acute hospital/medical centers, long term care facilities, home health, and local community clinics. ELAC Nursing Program is a part of the CSULA Collaborative for students who are both enrolled in the ELAC RN program and CSULA BSN program.
