This Intergenerational Drama Skills Certificate is designed to align with the Certificate of Achievement in Theater in the Community. This certificate better prepares students for internships and employment opportunities as a teaching artist in the health and social service industries.

Courses are offered in specific semesters and odd/even years as noted.

Program Description

The Intergenerational Drama Skills Certificate gives students solid academic and practical experience in producing theatrical productions for non-traditional venues. This certificate is a part of ELAC Storytheatre; a free program that tours senior centers, food banks and events throughout Los Angeles and the San Gabriel Valley. The Intergenerational Drama Skills Certificate also offers paid and unpaid internships and work based learning opportunities to develop skills to enter the workforce as a creative theatre specialist or teaching artist.

Career and Transfer Opportunities

The Theatre in the Community Program focuses on marketable skills to enter the educational, health, recreational or social service industry as a Creative Theatre Specialist or Teaching Artist. Upon completion of this skills certificate and the Theater in the Community Certificate of Achievement the student will have earned the practical, experiential and theoretical background required to design and produce theatrical experiences for children, older adults and under served communities in non-traditional theatrical venues or to continue on to a four-year degree with a pre-determined emphasis in education, applied therapeutic theatre, dance or psychology.
