

English 101 vs. English 101Z



Transfer Requirements

English 101 and English 101Z both satisfy English composition requirements for transfer to CSUs/ UCS.

24% higher pass rate

Students in English 101Z (previously English 101/72) on average pass with a 24% higher success rate than those who only take English 101.

How does English 101Z help you? Courses are 3 hours longer per week for:

- more time to work on concepts and skills.
- more time with your English 101 instructor to get help.
- more guidance on writing and reading.
- more in-class discussion about difficult assignments.
- more time learning with your peers.
- more time in a computer lab to develop skills.

Transfer Requirements: Fulfills English Composition requirements for AA,AS, AA-T, AS-T, and transfer.	
Reading Requirements: College level fiction and non-fiction articles and/or books. Reading strategies focused on analysis of academic, social topics.	
Writing Requirements: Organizational writing strategies such as outlines, rough drafts, quotation integration, and peer reviews. 5 text-based essays (including a mandatory research paper) focusing on critical thinking, research, and analysis.	
Student Work Expectations: Average of 9- 12 hours of course work per week outside of the classroom.	
3.00 units (lecture)	4.00 units (lecture and lab)
Meets 3 hours a week	Meets 6 hours a week
Recommended for students with a 2.6 and above GPA.	Recommended for students with a 2.6- 2.3 GPA. Required for students with 1.9 and below GPA.
Most of reading, writing, and assignments independently outside of class time. Comfortable using study skills, campus resources, and time management.	More in-class time and support with English 101 instructor to help the reading and writing process/assignments. Develop college success strategies via time management and study skills. Connect with campus resources.
