CALIFORNIA GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM (Cal-GETC) East Los Angeles College (2025–2026) University of California and California State University

Cal-GETC is the general education pathway for California Community College students to fulfill lower-division general education for the UC and CSU universities. It is also the GE requirement to earn an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT). Students should confirm with a counselor that the courses they select will also satisfy the admission requirements for their intended universities and majors.

New students who begin in Fall '25 or later or returning students who have lost catalog rights must follow this GE pattern. Continuing students with catalog rights prior to Fall '25 may continue with IGETC or CSU GE, or switch to Cal-GETC.

- All courses counted on Cal-GETC must be a minimum of 3 units (semester) or 4 units (quarter) and passed with a "C" or better.
 See Important Information section if taken Pass/No Pass.
- Courses listed are approved from <u>ELAC ONLY</u>. If you enroll in or have taken a course from a different college including other LACCD colleges, verify approval with a counselor and assist.org. Courses with the same prefix/number may not be approved.
- Any course listed in more than one area may only be used to satisfy one of the areas.
