

- Fulfill prerequisite requirements (no in-progress)
- Fulfill GPA requirements
 - Science GPA >= 2.5, may only repeat <u>one</u> class out of three classes; no recency requirement at ELAC
 - \circ Overall GPA >= 2.5

Admission Decision

- Selection is based on multi-criteria points to fill a cohort size of 30
- No waitlist
- Applications accepted twice a year (Spring and Fall)

 - US High School Graduate or equivalent (GED or High School Proficiency Test)
 - Completion of AA/AS or higher degree from a US accredited college or university
 - We DO NOT accept foreign high school diplomas



*Life Experience or Special Circumstances

- 1. **Individuals with Disabilities** Students reported with a primary disability anytime since fall 1990 through the current time- period are in the Students with Disabilities category. This is reported in MIS data element SD01 Student-Primary-Disability.
- 2. **Non-traditional Fields** -- A non-traditional student is a student that is in a program that leads to an occupation where their gender represents less than 25% of those employed. (Examples would be woman in automotive or men in nursing)
- 3. First Generation College Student- a student whose parent(s) did not complete a four-year college or university degree.
- 4. **Socially or educationally disadvantaged**—A individual is considered socially and or educationally disadvantaged if: student received a Promise grant and/or Pell Grant; has been identified as a WIOA participant; is a recipient of public aid (as defined by the California Department of Public Social Services).
- 5. **Low Income**: an individual whose family's taxable income for the preceding year did not exceed 150 percent of the poverty level amount, a person who lives in a household whose income is below average.



- Course schedule varies, weekdays, evenings, weekends
- Course delivery
 - Theory content (1-2 days per week)
 - Clinical clinical experience at affiliated facilities (1-2 days per week)
 - Skills lab (1-2 days per week)
- Clinical hours varies, depending on course level and specialty

Frequently Asked Questions

- TEAS 7: minimum score of 62 or above for each sub-category:
 - Reading >=62
 - Math >=62
 - Science >=62
 - English and Language Usage >=62

May only retake TEAS 7 test if there is a failed score in a subcategory.

Higher scores will not be accepted if the previous attempt already had passing scores.

TEAS 7 FAQ cont'd

TEAS ranking Point Example:

First Attempt: 78, 65, 52, 66

Second Attempt: 83, 68, 62, 70

Third Attempt: 84, 73, 65, 78

Multi-criteria point calculation will be based on scores received from the second attempt as that is the first report card with all passing scores. Subsequent higher scores from subsequent attempts will not be used for ranking points.

FAQs cont'd

If offered admission....

- COVID vaccine and booster is still required by clinical facility
- Must have full vaccine series including latest vaccines
- Please discuss all vaccine related questions with your healthcare provider
- Vaccine documentation/CDC Vaccine card required

Note: Vaccine proof is optional to submit with the application packet

FAQs cont'd

- Must be 18 with a valid ID or driver license (for Live Scan)
- US High School Transcript or GED or College degree is required.
- First generation college students: provide statement (less than one page) explaining your situation.
- Healthcare Professionals: must submit employment verification letters indicating position and period of employment, minimum 1000 hours (equivalent to six months full-time employment).
- How to combine PDF: only submit one PDF only submit one PDF (watch youtube videos if need assistance how to combine PDFs for PCs or Macs)


