Planning and issues of operating a child development program under the Title 22 Department of Social Services Community Care Licensing regulations are considered. Also included is a review of common child-hood diseases, universal health precautions, First Aid and CPR requirements, environmental safety, nutritional planning, and special health considerations of the young child.

Survey of the political, economic, and cultural history of the United States from earliest colonial times to

reconstruction with emphasis on the role and contributions of African Americans to the shaping of U.S. History.

Includes a study of the U.S. Constitution and federal government. This course approaches these concepts through an

Ethnic Studies lens, to better understand the intersection and impact of race, ethnicity and other forms of difference upon communities of color, as well as how these communities' response to discrimination is relevant to current issues. Note: AFRO AM 004 may be taken after AFRO AM 005.

p. 363 AFRO AM 005 The History of the African-American in the History of the U.S. II (3) UC:CSU  
Survey of the political, economic, and cultural history of the United States from reconstruction to the present with emphasis on the role and contributions of African Americans to the shaping of US History. This course approaches these concepts through an Ethnic Studies lens, to better understand the intersection and impact of race, ethnicity and other forms of difference upon communities of color, as well as how these communities' response to discrimination is relevant to current issues. Note: AFRO AM 005 may be taken before AFRO AM 004.

AFRO AM 019 Introduction to African American Studies (3) CSU

This ethnic studies course introduces students to the field of African American studies. It investigates how African American studies came to be a discipline of study and the shapes it took in its initial formations. Students explore the ways that various community members, activists, students, teachers, scholars, artists, musicians, poets, and filmmakers have contributed to thinking about Black experiences both historically and contemporarily. Finally, students consider current Black struggles for freedom, for justice, and for humanity through an ethnic studies lens.

HISTORY 083 History of LGBTQIA Communities in the United States (3) CSU

This introductory course examines a broad range of contemporary and historical gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer, and intersex issues in various contexts including, but not limited to, bio-medical, sociological, political, racial, and sexual in the United States.

LECTURE, 1 HOUR

This course trains students in individual and group tutoring and instructional techniques, group dynamics, interpersonal skills, record-keeping, organizational skills, and study skills. It covers tutoring and instructional strategies that promote independent learning. This course is intended for students who wish to tutor for any disciplines or units on the campus and who are interested in learning, teaching, and applying effective instructional and tutoring techniques.

VOC ED 138CE Nursing Concepts (0)

LECTURE, 1 HOUR; LABORATORY, 3 HOURS

This course is designed to provide Pre-Nursing and/or newly accepted Nursing students with an overview of the knowledge, skills and aptitudes needed to be successful in a Nursing program. Specific activities assist students with critically analyzing the nursing concepts of student success and learning styles; Maslow's Hierarchy of Needs; nursing processes; medical terminology related to Nursing Pharmacology; hygiene and comfort; safety; and universal standard precautions; strategies to strengthen areas needing improvement; and developing self-assessment and critical thinking skills.

Speaking focuses on the clear pronunciation of common words and continues the development of English pronunciation patterns. Students observe and practice appropriate verbal and nonverbal behavior in one-on-one and/or small group settings.
